Edith A. Copley is professor of music and director of choral studies at Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff. She received her MM and DMA degrees in conducting from the College-Conservatory of Music in Cincinnati and a BA degree in music education from Luther College in Decorah, Iowa.

In Flagstaff she conducts the renowned Shrine of the Ages Choir, as well as the Vocal Chamber Ensemble and Master Chorale of

Flagstaff. Dr. Copley also coordinates the graduate choral conducting program and teaches courses in graduate conducting and choral literature. Choral ensembles under her direction have performed at state and regional ACDA conventions and the 1998 national

MENC convention. NAU choirs have toured throughout the United States as well as the People's Republic of China, Germany, Austria, Hungary, the Czech Republic, Italy, and Switzerland.

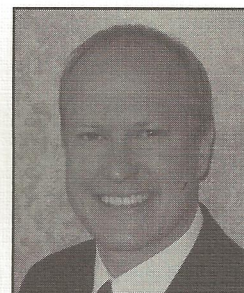
Dr. Copley taught secondary choral music in the Iowa public schools for several years prior to serving for four years as the chairperson of the fine arts department at the American International School in Vienna, Austria. She has also served as the assistant and interim principal conductor of the May Festival Chorus that performs with the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra and Cincinnati Pops. She has prepared major choral/orchestral works for Robert Shaw, James Conlon, Jesus Lopez-Cobes, Randall Fleischer, and Eric Kunzel.

In April 1995, Dr. Copley became the first woman to conduct the Flagstaff Symphony Orchestra in a classic series concert, and in 1999-2000 served as the symphony's resident conductor for their 50th anniversary season, conducting three performances in the classic concert series, including Brahms' German Requiem.

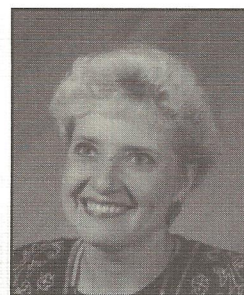
Dr. Copley received the Centennial Teacher of the Year Award in the School of Performing Arts at Northern Arizona University in 1999. She is currently president-elect of the Western Division of the American Choral Directors Association. Dr. Copley is in high demand as a guest conductor and clinician for choral festivals and conventions throughout the U.S. She has

conducted All-State honor choirs in eleven states. In 2001, Dr. Copley conducted the Association for Music in International Schools (AMIS) Honor Choir in Berlin, Germany. She will conduct the AMIS Honor Choir in March 2004 in The Hague, Netherlands. In May 2004, Dr. Copley will be the guest conductor for an international choral/orchestral festival in Rothenburg, Germany, performing Verdi's "Requiem." ♦

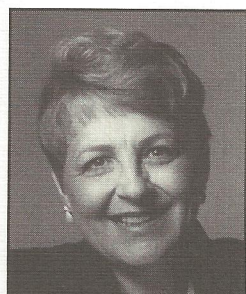

Mary Alice Stollak is Director of Choral Activities for the Community Music School at Michigan State University, where she is the Founding Director of the MSU Children's Choir. Before taking this position she was Associate Professor of Music at the University of Michigan-Flint. She was also Director of Choral Activities for the Haslett (Michigan) Public Schools and served as the choral director for the National High School Music Institute at Northwestern University for eighteen years. Stollak has appeared as festival guest conductor and workshop presenter in twenty-two states as well as Sweden, Germany, Italy and Argentina. Her choirs have frequently appeared at national, divisional and state American Choral Directors Association conventions.

The Michigan State University Children's Choir, under her direction, performed at the Sixth World Symposium on Choral Music in August of 2002 as the official U.S. representative. They recently were contributors to William Bolcom's monumental "Songs of Innocence and Experience," on the Naxos label, led by American conductor Leonard Slatkin, and premiered Ellen Taffee Zwilich's "Symphony No. 4: The Gardens" which is recorded on the Koch label. Stollak also pre-

pared the MSUCC to appear under the batons of Neeme Järvi and Gustav Meier. They shared performances with Marvin Hamlisch, Marilyn Horne, and the Canadian Brass.

Santa Barbara Music Publishing Company publishes the *Mary Alice Stollak Choral Series*, a set of treble choral publications that present works by several composers in a variety of musical styles.

Mary Alice Stollak served as President of the ACDA Central Division, ACDA-Michigan and the Michigan School Vocal Music Association. She was the 2001 recipient of the "Maynard Klein Award for Lifetime Achievement and Dedication to the Choral Art," given by the American Choral Directors Association of Michigan and the YWCA

"Diana Award" for her contributions to the arts in mid-Michigan. ♦

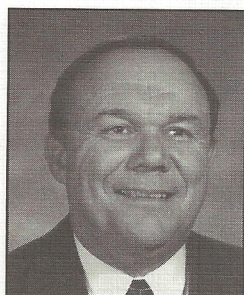

Bruce Phelps recently retired from a 34-year teaching career which included five years as choral director at Luverne, Minnesota, one year at Wayzata High School and 28 years as choral director at Anoka High School in Anoka, Minnesota.

Bruce received his B.A. degree from Concordia College in Moorhead, MN, in 1970 and his Master's degree from Bemidji State University in 1978. Besides his role as choral director at Anoka High School, Bruce was the director of music and conducted an adult choir at the Anoka United Methodist Church, was on the music education staff at St. Olaf, where he taught choral methods and choral literature, and founded his own select adult chorus, The Two Rivers Chorale. Bruce also served for five years as director of the South St. Paul Male Chorus, eight years as director of the 3M Male Chorus, and nine years as Director of Music at Zion Lutheran Church in Anoka. He has been the guest clinician at numerous choral festivals in Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Alaska, serves as an adjudicator for contests throughout the state and is the master presenter in the certification process for music adjudicators sponsored by the Minnesota

State High School League. Bruce has written and published a Sight Reading Manual and a Music Mastery Manual and has two choral pieces with Kjos Music.

While he was at Anoka, his choirs were very active, having performed seven times at MMEA conventions, twice at ACDA conventions, four times at the St. Olaf Choral festival, three times as a solo choir at the Dorian festival at Luther College, three times at the Concordia College Choral Festival, and twice at Bemidji State's Chorfest, as well as seven other local and college festivals throughout the upper Midwest. Students from Anoka traveled to Austria, Germany, Italy, and Switzerland in the summer of 1996 and England, Wales, and Ireland in 1999 where the Anoka Choir won the grand championship at the Gateway International Music Festival in Leicester, England.

Bruce was named Outstanding Music Educator of Minnesota by the National Federation of State High School Associations in 1995 and received the Golden Apple Award from the Ashland Corporation in 1996. For the year 1999-2000, Bruce also received the Outstanding Music Educator Award from the Minnesota Music Education Association for his efforts and leadership in the classroom and beyond. Bruce has been a Regional Representative to the Minnesota State High School League, has served as Choral Vice President for MMEA, and has been the Northeast Regional Representative and R & S representative for Community Choirs for ACDA of Minnesota.

In the summer of 2004, Bruce left teaching and moved to the Moorhead, Minnesota, area where he is now the Associate Director of Music Organizations for Concordia College. Bruce's duties include organizing choir tours, managing all logistic aspects of the choirs, and

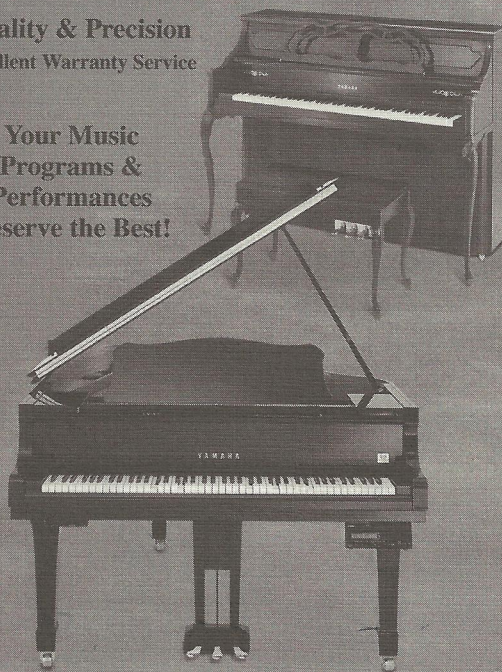

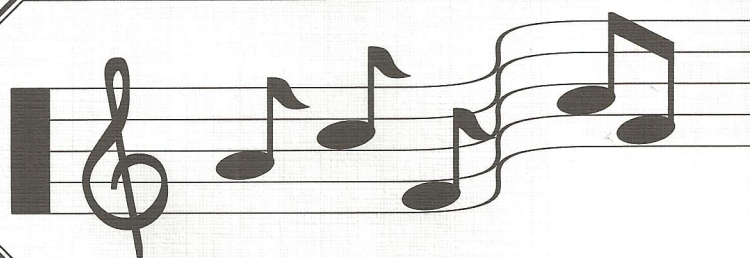
