Judith Willoughby is the Wanda L. Bass Professor of Conducting and Choral Music Education at Oklahoma City University and Artistic Director of the Canterbury Academy of the Vocal Arts, the youth choral program of the Canterbury Choral Society. She has conducted choruses of all genres in festival concerts, honor choirs and all-state choruses in the world's major concert halls throughout North America, Europe, the Caribbean and Asia. In 2003, Ms. Willoughby conducted

the Women's Honor Choir at ACDA's national convention. She has also conducted ACDA divisional conventions for the Eastern (twice), Central and North Central Divisions. She also made her choral/orchestral debut at Carnegie Hall conducting the Robert Levin edition of Mozart's *Requiem*. For many years she lived in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania where she served terms as state president of

Pennsylvania's ACDA and president of the PA Collegiate Choral Association.

In 1991, Professor Willoughby founded the Temple University Children's Choir, leading that ensemble to international promiBrian Stubbs, MMEA Choral Vice-President

nence. Highlights of her work with the chorus included four trips to Puerto Rico for intercultural exchanges with the San Juan Children's Choir, an appearance at the national ACDA convention in 1997, numerous appearances with the Philadelphia (PA) Orchestra, live radio and television broadcasts on National Public Radio, recordings for the Silver Burdett Ginn Series which was released in 2002, and in 2000, an appearance at the Oregon Bach Festival under the baton of Helmut Rilling with the Oregon Bach Festival Choir and Orchestra. She also founded and led the Choral Society of Montgomery County (PA) for twenty years, which won a gold medal in international competition in Australia's Sydney Opera House and was heard many times on National Public Radio. Willoughby has taught at Northwestern

University, Temple University, and the Summer Institute programs of Eastman's School of Music, Westminster Choir College and Central Connecticut State University.

She has served on numerous panels for the National Endowment for the Arts, state and private arts agencies, served on the board of Chorus America for nine years, and continues her work on that organization's conducting task force. Judith Willoughby edits a choral series published by Alliance Music. She is a member of the Music Educators National Conference (MENC), the International Federation of Choral Music (IFCM), the College Music Society, and is a life member of ACDA. •

Brad Holmes holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from Arizona State University. His work in the choral field ranges across age levels in professional, educational and amateur settings. He remains an avid church musician. On the university level, Dr. Holmes served six years as Associate Director of Choirs at Luther College. He became Director of Choir Programs at Millikin University in Decatur, Illinois, in 1991.

In his fifteen years at Millikin, Dr. Holmes has overseen the growth of the choral program to six traditional choirs and a variety of smaller vocal ensembles involving 250 students and six choral/vocal ensemble staff. In addition to conducting the University Choir and Millikin Men, Dr. Holmes teaches classes in conducting and choral methods. He is artistic director for Millikin's annual Christmas Vespers, which attracts 6,500 people each year.

Dr. Holmes extensive guest conducting schedule has included All-State and District festivals as well as church music clinics throughout the United States. Internationally, he served a term as a Visiting Fellow at Wolfson College in Cambridge, England. He has conducted choirs in over 30 countries in Europe, South America, East Asia, the South Pacific and Australia. Upcoming international engagements include an invitation to conduct the Royal Free Singers of London in a program of American music. •



René Clausen, MMEA All-State Mixed Choir Conductor

The 2005-06 academic year marks **René Clausen's** 20th year as conductor of the Concordia Choir of Concordia College, Moorhead Minnesota. He is also Artistic Director of the award-winning Concordia Christmas Concerts, seen on PBS nationwide and also featured on radio stations across the country.

René Clausen is in frequent demand, both as a conductor and as a composer, often serving as guest clinician, festival conductor, composer-in-residence, lecturer and motivational speaker worldwide. He specializes in conducting the choral/orchestral repertoire, having conducted such works as the Brahms *Requiem*, Mozart *Requiem* and *Mass in C Minor*, Beethoven *9th Symphony*, *Choral Fantasy*, and *Mass in C*, Faure *Requiem*, Vaughan Williams *Hodie*, and Poulenc *Gloria*, plus several of his own choral/orchestral works including *Communion*, *Whispers of Heavenly Death*, and *Gloria* (in three movements).

René Clausen is also a well-known composer and arranger, having written over fifty commissioned compositions which are frequently performed worldwide. His compositional style is varied and eclectic, ranging from works appropriate for high school and church

choirs to more technically demanding compositions for college and professional choirs. Interested in composing for various media, Clausen's compositional interests include works for the stage, solo voice, film and video composition, choral/orchestral compositions and arrangements, as well as works for orchestra and wind ensemble. He regularly composes on a commission basis, and is a frequent guest conductor and composer-in-residence nationally and internationally. Special commissions include *Canticle of Praise* written for the King's Singers and the Mormon Tabernacle Choir, as well as all of the choral scoring and arrangements for the musical *T*E*X*A*S*. Dr. Clausen has on two occasions written commissions at the request of the American Choral Directors Association. In 1994, he composed *Crying for A Dream*, a three-movement work based on Native American themes premiered at the North Central regional ACDA convention in Rapid City, South Dakota. In 2002, Dr. Clausen was commissioned to write the Raymond W. Brock Memorial Commission for the 2003 national ACDA convention In New York City. Written for chorus, orchestra, and baritone solo, his composition *MEMORIAL* was inspired by the tragic events of 9/11/01 in New York City, and was premiered by the Concordia College Choir and Orchestra at Lincoln Center on February 15, 2003. ◆


