Johann Pachelbel was born in 1653. From 1674 to 1677 he was assistant organist at St. Stephen's in Vienna. Later on we find him in Eisenach, Erfurt—where he remained twelve years—Stuttgart and Gotha. In 1695 he became organist at St. Sebald's, in his native town of Nuremberg. He died in 1706.

The Magnificat is Mary's song-poem (Luke 1: 46-55) which has become the great Evening Hymn of the Lutheran Church. As the song of a lowly soul raised to dizzy and dangerous heights, yet preserving its humility and magnifying God alone, Mary's canticle is particularly commended to all persons everywhere, especially those better favored than others.
