## ANNOUNCEMENTS OF INTEREST

The Select Choir participated in the St. Olaf College Choral Festival on November 5, 1989. They joined 1200 high school, college, and church choir members singing under retiring director, Kenneth Jennings. December 9, 1989, the Select Choir competed with six other choirs at the Bergen Competition. Although the setting was less than ideal, the musicianship and unity of the choir prevailed. They won the \$1000 first prize.

The District #281 Vocal/Orchestral Festival will be at Robbinsdale-Cooper H.S. this year. All RAHS choirs and the orchestra will join with RCHS groups under Paul Oakley, the popular director of last year's excellent festival. The featured extended work will be Haydn's Te Deum.
